Our pupils are 11-16 years and have been excluded or are close to being excluded from mainstream school. Pupils are referred to us by schools and the Local Authority. Our Teaching groups are small between 2 and 8 pupils per class. We currently have 38 pupils on role. Working on a model which is like a primary setting, the pupils remain in their form room for over half of their timetable and are taught in small groups. Our curriculum focuses on Science, Reading, English, Maths, PE and Art, Cooking, PSHE, Humanities and Outdoor Education.
